I've put together two paint palettes to suit different styles and aesthetics. One is a modern, traditional palette with neutrals that's perfect if you love keeping things monochromatic and classic






#### The Concept

#### Walls and Trim

#### Let's talk about the basics...


For walls, I typically recommend an eggshell finish. This sheen offers a beautiful slight sheen appearance that's durable yet subtle, perfect for enhancing natural light without causing glare. For trim, I like to go with a satin finish. This more higher shine of satin not only highlights the architectural details but also makes the trim more resistant to scuffs and easier to clean. This combination of eggshell for walls and satin for trim strikes the perfect balance between elegance and practicality.

#### Color Trends

Traditionally, we've seen lighter trims paired with darker walls. Think of a light gray wall with crisp white trim. This approach is classic and still works beautifully. However, a current twist I'm particularly fond of is reversing this trend. Painting your walls a lighter color and using a darker or more contrasting shade for the trim can create a stunning effect that's current, yet timeless. This may push you out of your comfort zone, but trust us, it's worth a try!






### "Green Smoke" & "Parma Gray"




#### The Concept

## paint sheen reference guide:

#### FLAT & MATTE -



- Non-reflective appearance, hides slight imperfections.
- Mostly used for ceilings but could also be good for low traffic areas - offices or bedrooms.

#### EGGSHELL -



- Low luster, velvety appearance, somewhat easy to clean.
- Most versatile for walls family rooms,
   bedrooms, dining rooms, hallways, entryways.

#### SATIN -



- Pearl-like appearance, slightly reflective, easy to clean.
- I would never recommend on walls since there is too high of a shine. Good for - millwork, molding, interior doors or wood paneled walls.

## SEMI-GLOSS

#### SEMI-GLOSS & HIGH-GLOSS -

- Easy to clean, resistance to dirt, stains and mildew, highlights any imperfections.
- Good for millwork in areas with moisture bathrooms/laundry rooms or as a decorative statement. Could even be used on ceilings for a reflective "wow" factor.
- NOTE: high-gloss is extremely durable but it does take a long time to cure and dry.



### Hools & supplies checklist:

Paint brush for cutting along trim: Our go-to is a 2" firm and angled brush for sleek lines
<u>Paint sprayer</u> : Ideal for larger rooms, check out video tutorials to master the technique.
Paint stick: Effortlessly stores and applies paint without constant re-dipping
<u>Primer for lime pain</u> t: A tried and true primer that we use every time for optimal results
<u>Plastic roller wrap</u> : Comes already pre-taped, perfect for taping off areas and windows
